WHAT IS SEFA?

SEFA is a single combined Campaign for employees of New York State, supported by labor and management.

It brings together, 255 United Way Agencies, 145 Independent and Non-Affiliated Agencies, 33 International Service Agencies, 47 Earth Share of New York Agencies, 49 Independent Charities of America, 31 Community Health Charities, 29 America's Charities Agencies, 20 Share America! The SEFA Campaign will be the only time State Employees are asked to give at the worksite during the entire year.



WHY PAYROLL DEDUCTION

Making a pledge in bi-weekly installments through the SEFA Payroll Deduction plan allows you to be more generous than may be possible if you had to give a one-time cash gift. Payroll deduction will begin January 1, 2001 and end December 31, 2001. In the event you change positions, you will need to contact Audit and Control to continue your pledge. Payroll pledges to SEFA may be canceled anytime during the year by contacting your payroll office.

You have the opportunity to designate all or a portion of your gift to a specific agency or federation listed in the SEFA brochure. Designations to agencies or federations will be honored first. Designations are encouraged to reflect the wishes of the donors.

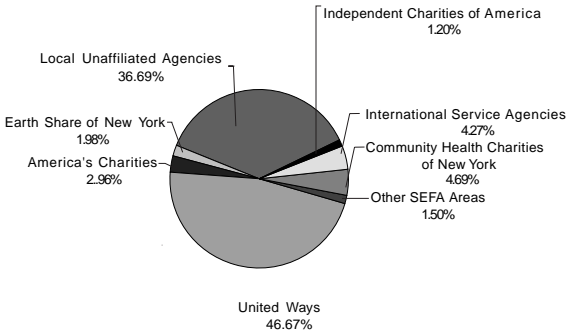

WHAT YOUR GIFT WILL DO....

When you contribute to the SEFA Campaign, your dollars help people in your community, across the nation, and around the world. For an indication of how you can help, see the list below:

- \$1.00 per week immunizes 50 babies against tetanus, a common deadly disease in poor countries.
- \$1.00 per week provides enough Vitamin A to save 50 children from nutritional blindness for one year.
- \$1.00 per week provides support to one family that has experienced the death of a family member, also education about teen suicide and prevention.
- \$1.50 per week provides a water pump for irrigating parched agricultural fields in Ethiopia.
- \$1.50 per week provides support for four victims of rape or sexual assault at the hospital, in court, and through support groups.
- \$2.00 per week allows a volunteer to deliver four hot meals to two senior citizens each week.
- \$2.50 per week allows four teenagers to receive services that emphasize positive self-esteem, decision making skills and communication skills.
- \$3.00 per week provides one day of child care to 52 children.
